SUMMARY OF STUDENT FEEDBACK 2022-2023

In relation to the completion of syllabus, majority of B.Sc. Nursing students rated as satisfactory (104) and 52 students rated outstanding. Helps students irrespective of gender 60 students responded very satisfactory and 85 satisfactory. Regarding cleanliness and hygiene in classroom 61 responded very satisfactory and 68 satisfactory. 61 students were very satisfied about the toilet and washroom hygiene. 60 responded very satisfactory and 63 satisfied about R.O drinking water facility with water cooler. Transport facility for field trip 71students said very satisfied & 57 were satisfied. 77 students said satisfied regarding access to college library. 88 responded satisfactory and 55 very satisfactory about provision of counselling. Adequate number of simulator and model 94 responded satisfactory. 62 students were very satisfied and 77 satisfied that individual students get exposed to the labs. Adequate number of supplies i.e article, instruments etc 62 students were very satisfactory and 73 students were satisfactory. 77 students were very satisfied and 67 responded satisfied about the supervision by teachers during lab hours. About use of technology and innovative teaching methods for teaching-learning 86 students were very satisfied and 68 responded satisfied. 56 students were satisfied


























SUMMARY OF FACULTY FEEDBACK 2022-2023

A total of 27 faculty gave the feedback on curriculum.

The conceptual view of major concern are as follows:

In terms of depth of syllabus is adequate in relation to competencies expected by the profession's current global scenario,59.4 % gave the view that they are agreed to it.where as in case of curriculum updation at institute level 51.9% agreed and 25.4 % strongly agreed to the aspect.In relation to System followed by the institute for design and development of curriculum is effective 70.4% faculty agreed to it.44.4% agreed to the point that department level subject expert committee occurs regularly and 25.9% strongly agreed to it.In terms of the curriculum incorporates recent technological development in the area. (Use of digital and online methods and research evidences), 66.7% agreed. 14.8% faculty strongly agreed that faculty improve knowledge by attending workshop and conferences where as 55.6% agreed to it. 61.5% of faculty agreed that individual and departmental research projects added in the curriculum. In case of students centred learning facilities, 66.7% agreed to it.

55% of faculty agreed that lab facilities are adequate to meet practical aspects. (Mannequins and equipment available).



In terms of professional transformation, about 56.3% agreed that it is expected. 62.5% agreed that curriculum provides opportunities for self learning and extra learning, where as 33.3% didn't have the opinion. 54.2% of student alumni has the opinion and agreed that institute support and contribute to the overall development, where as a slight percentage 10.4% disagreed to it. 45.8% agreed that teacher quality and attitude towards teaching and students in the place is appreciative and 8.3% even disagreed to it. In terms of facility in lab, equipment and library which promote practice and learning, 41.7% agreed to it where as 6.3% strongly agreed and 10.4% disagreed also. While 41.7% remained neutral in giving the opinion. 62.5 % of alumni agreed that sports, cultural and extracurricular activities enable the overall development of developments and 16.7% strongly agreed also to it. Among the alumni, 56.3% have the feeling that depict satisfied that clinical experience from parent hospital and community out-posting exposure is adequate and 16.7% strongly felt it. 47.9% of alumni agreed that development of the institute in recent years is appreciative, but as a fluctuated figure 4.2% disagreed to it.




Total of 32 parents gave their views on overall aspects. The results showed that the parents are confident about most of the curricular and other important concerns of their ward while they study at this place.







The concised results are as follows:






















SUMMARY OF PROFESSIONAL FEEDBACK REPORT 2022-2023

We have taken feedback about curriculum from experts in the profession. Total 6 professional gave their expert suggestions and feedback. In terms of the design of curriculum, only 33.33% felt that design of syllabi is sufficient in terms of global development in education and technology. Where as other 66.7% said that it is not sufficient. Around 33.33% were ok with the idea that B.Sc. Nursing curriculum enable a student to understand gaps in nursing career where as majority: 66.7% has the opposite idea. The concept of Nursing course covers all human care needs of modern life, almost both sided opinion showed that it can be or it cannot be the same syllabi. In relation to the current teaching pattern and examination, 33.33% felt that it focus on learner's view on the nursing career; where as the majority have not the same but opposite idea. The idea of Syllabus and curriculum provide adequate options for short courses that focus future nursing career, around 66.7% said it provides where as 33.33% said it don't. To the statement; the core curriculum enable a student to be independent and manage all types of patients : 66.7% agreed it do, where as low majority-33.33% said it don't. almost equal experts opined Yes and at the same time No to the concept that students examination results reflect their skills in nursing. The idea of the practical and theory syllabus (INC/MPMSU) balance in view of skill requirement in modern nursing, the reaction was almost one sided with vast majority of 66.7% with yes where as others -33.33% opined it balances.

In terms of open ended queries, mixed opinions and suggestions received.

Even then overall score with minimum poll showed that curriculum revision is required from time to time.
