CRITERION I - CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. 1 words

The IQAC of Choithram College of Nursing conducts meeting to discuss of activities in the commencement of new academic session for effective delivery of curriculum with a view of providing more improved academic experience for the students in all curricular aspects. In a view to pandemic, classes were structured and delivered through online platform. Academic calendar of events is prepared and all class co-ordinator master rotation plan, clinical rotation plan and monthly theory plan the INC syllabus and university prescribed hours which is presented in faculty meeting headed by Principal and all teaching faculty were informed for the scheduling of whole sessions. The institution functions through five specialities. The entire syllabus of particular subject is planned and divided among the respective faculty members. Later, a schedule is being discussed in the department meetings in which topics of syllabus are distributed in the meeting. Class co-ordinator, make regular monthly progress of the sessions and any issues regarding curriculum delivery corrected were discussed in regular faculty meetings. In addition, a well equipped library is facilitated to the students as well as entire department.

Also, each department has their own departmental libraries for references. A good number of journals are also available in the department. Periodic on-line evaluation of theory, clinical and the progress of students is implemented by the coordinators and make sure the completion of theory and conduction of internal examination in time. During the lockdown, an online evaluation system was adopted among students. Besides, continuous assessment, pre and post clinical performance of each student is as per a specific clinical evaluation format which was implemented during the covid times (October 2019 to March, 2020). The progress of students in clinical were monitored weekly and handed over to instructor responsible for the same as students posting. Clinical case study presentation and clinical progress are given to the students to develop clinical judgement and skill effectively. During the covid times, students were evaluated online through zoom meet gateway by conducting one to one interaction and by giving assessment to them. External expert classes are also arranged for the students for their learning. In the view of examination, online written examination and viva was conducted for students. Regular clinical meetings and faculty meetings (online as well as offline) were conducted and documented regarding the student progression. Apart from academics, college organizes co-curricular activities e.g. sports, talent hour, days celebration and also provide student opportunities to participate in competitions and events organized by various institutions as well as through online means. Focusing on holistic health days including yoga was observed, also, debate and quiz competition were organized for their overall development. It is mandatory for teachers and students to participate in International and National health days which are observed during the academic year so that they remain updated and sensitized for national cause. Being an institute affiliated to Madhya Pradesh Medical Sciences University, Jabalpur (MPMSU), Madhya Pradesh Nurses Registration Council (MPNRC) Bhopal and Indian Nursing Council (INC) New Delhi, we follow the academic schedule provided by these governing bodies.
