15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Vision of the College of nursing is to focus on all round development of nursing students & empowering nursing profession through an integrated education, holistic health care services and clinical research. Focusing on holistic development of students' institute has provided with regular Yoga Classes, Sessions on Mindful meditation to the students & faculty members, had signed MoU with SPBASS organization who are trainer and provider of alternative medicine and naturopathy approved by Ministry of AYUSH. Every year M.Sc students going for residential posting to Pune at Holistic Health education and Healing Center,

Bibwewadi Pune. In order to delineate the institutional approach towards integration of humanities Active NSS unit is there, regular health camps were organized. STEM approach is inbuild in curricula as Anatomy, pathology, drug calculations, handing of medical monitoring devices, and innovative approaches in teaching like problem-based learning, evidence-based practice etc. It is mandate for Undergraduate & Post graduate students to submit research projects in thrust areas in hospital as well as community.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic bank of credit is the future vision of institution, yet not officially register for it. As per INC & MPMSU guideline nursing is as full-time professional course with mandatory completion of theory and practical hours, student cannot register for dual degree. Students are provided with the option for value added and elective modules. MSc Nursing students have choice to select the subject specialization & super Specialization. Faculties are involved in writing books, publishing materials, developing innovating teaching methodology, assignments are structured in a way that appeal for comprehension and critical thinking. Incidental teaching and assignments also given in clinical area to improve understanding and decision-making skills among students. Every student's complete log is maintained in Transcript register and year wise logbook in which theory, practical hours completed details of procedures performed, clinical area-wise hours completed, conference workshop attended, post holder details etc. were documented.

17.Skill development:

Choithram College of Nursing have Six fully equipped Nursing Skill labs ie 1. Nursing Foundation Lab, 2. Adult Nursing Lab/Advance skill Lab, 3. Pre-clinical Lab, 4. Child Health Nursing Lab, 5. Obstetrics & Gynaecology Lab, 6. Community Health Nursing lab. All Labs are equipped with various fidelity manikins to cater needs of student's clinical experience from basic to advance level. All students were trained in a way that enhance employability of the students at the end of the session. Students offered with certificate course in Yoga, naturopathy, ACLS, BLS, Neonatal resuscitation, Antenatal & postnatal counselling skills and otheretc. For life skill education, training sessions on yoga and heartful meditation were done. Lectures from Brahma Kumari's were organized so that students have better adaptation and coping skill at the time of stress. Students were sensitized regarding online courses on MOOC, SWAYAM and other platforms by educational

committee.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

In order to sensitize with Indian Culture every year Onam, Holi, Ganapathi Sthapna, Christmas, Diwali were celebrated. Events on folk dance, fancy dress on cultural theme were organized. Hindi Diwas, Constitution Day, Partition Days were celebrated under the banner of NSS. In order to sensitize students regarding Indian art and culture representative from UDAN marketing MP Handlooms and handicraft visited our institution and explained about making of different handlooms and legacy of its making and the area which belongs to particular block prints. Lectures were delivered in bilingually (in Hindi and English). Students are allowed to write their university exam in either Hindi or English. Students were sensitized with Duolingo app which offer 30+ languages to learn free of cost. Language Lab is also there for students who wants assistance with English.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Our Mission is to develop dedicated; committed; service minded nursing community with a passion for excellence in every field of their endeavor. We focus on skill-based learning, first year onwards and focus on skill base learning, they were first trained in simulation lab, practice there, do return demonstration then practice in clinical setting, regular skill Stations, OSCE, Drills were conducted. Regular trainings of BSL, NRP, BNRP and Natural Birthing and respectful Maternity care are focused. In fourth year, there is an integration of Certificate Course in Community Health, provides ready employability in Government Sector, All final Year students have to complete mandatory internship and after completion of internship students have to undergo Seven days Training Programme of "Practice to Perfect" to prepare and update the students to work in NABH Accredited Hospitals as they complete the course. Students were trained in such a way that they are readily got job after fourth year. BSc Nursing Graduate as well as MSc Nursing Graduate apart from direct patient care they were in leadership and administrative post too. They were posted not only in India but also recruited globally.

20.Distance education/online education:

Students are sensitizing with MOOC, Swayam Platform, Shodhganda, Sodhsindhu, Digital Library etc. from first year onwards as it is the mandatory objective of Education and library committee.

Assistance for the same are also provided to the students by the committee. Faculty are also enrolled in online courses as a part of continuous learning in SWAYAM, BMJ education, PHFI Faculty and facilitators use blended learning through online contents, videos, email, power-point presentation, URL and You Tube links. Students provided with the refence, content to go through before class and instructed to come prepared for discussion. Problem and case scenarios also shared with them and instruct them to come prepare with the possible care and solution, this helps students to develop critical thinking. Students are also participate in online conferences, workshop, webinar, competitions time to time.

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning, delivery and evaluation through a well defined process as prescribed by the respective regulatory councils and the affiliating University.

The institution uses a methodical mechanism to ensure efficient delivery of the curriculum. The college adheres to the academic calendar. The Principal monitors effective implementation of the Calendar through formal meetings with Heads of Departments. The Heads of departments schedule the department's activities while class teachers in coordination with HODs assign subjects and review the syllabus. The accomplishment of theory and practical tasks is monitored by academic and clinical coordinators. Exam coordinators oversee internal exams, and handle matters of university exams. IQAC periodically evaluates the curriculum delivery. There is optimum utilization of well-equipped laboratories for practical training. Our library has provisions of online digital library other than national and international journals, and extended study hours for slow learners. We sensitize students on Massive Open Online courses. Students and faculty attend expert lectures, seminars, conference and improve their knowledge. Our faculties participate in ToT courses to enhance

their training skills. Formative assessment is done regularly to identify gaps in students. The college collects the feedback from the stake holders which is analyzed and if any discrepancies identified, are considered for correction and improvement.

Student centric methods helps learner in setting mind, enhance their problem solving and decision making ability when they are given opportunity to gauge their own learning. The courses offered by institute are clearly defined by the course objectives, program objectives and program outcomes by INC (Indian Nursing Council). Institute organizes workshop, seminars, conferences, orientation training programmes, simulation based classes, experimental learning, problem solving methodologies to enhance the learning experiences of the students. Institution is following TAL (Teacher Assisted Learning) and planning to begin with PAL (Peer Assisted Learning). Students are sensitized against gender discrimination and sexual harassment. Different simulations are used in the courses which help the student to generate different scenario and accordingly take a decision. Audio- Visual methodology, Language Lab, Industrial Visits, Field Work and Projects are some of the means utilize by departments to provide experiential and participative learning. The Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) of students includes seminars, assignments, and Internal Assessment examinations. The department head and stream coordinator assess and approve the question papers that the course instructors create using the updated Bloom's Taxonomy and the evaluation scheme.

The internal assessment test timetable prepared by the examination committee is shared with students and exams are organized as per guidelines. Eligibility for appearing students in exams is based on their attendance in theory (80%) and practical or clinical (100%). Final internal marks of the students are prepared and sent to the university on the basis of these exams.

As part of Ayushman Bharat the Community Health Officers (CHOs) are a new cadre of non- physician health workers. In order to train the CHOs a Certificate Program in Community Health has been developed by IGNOU in collaboration with MoHFW, Govt. of India. This is a 6 month duration certificate course which comprises of 2 Theory & 1 Practical Program and Includes 120 hours counselling for theory and 300 hours for practical sessions. The practical posting areas include Sub health center, Primary Health Center both rural and urban, Community health center and District hospital respectively. The evaluation of the program is done through self-assessment, checking of assignment, log book and finally through Term End Examinations. Candidate should obtain at least 50% marks separately in internal evaluation and final examination in each of theory and practical papers. In the year 2021 from July- Dec and Oct - Mar 3 batches were enrolled from IGNOU and MPMSU for the course. For session Jun-Nov 2022, 60 students got enrolled for the training program. For the counselling session of both theory and practical 9 teachers from the college has been appointed as Academic Counsellors for both Universities

A major centre for kidney transplants, liver transplants, advanced skin banking, PET-Scan and all modern treatment facilities are available.

The hospital built-up area with an outpatient and an inpatient block. It consists of OPD services in general medicine, surgery, ENT, orthopaedic, dermatology, gynaecology, obstetrics, ophthalmology, paediatrics, psychiatric, and TB and chest medicine speciality to care for people with various disorders.

Emergency services are available 24×7 in casualty , emergency wards and intensive care units. On average daily admission varies

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from 70-80 patients. Inpatient services are provided in various specialities and wards are located in the first, second, and third floor.

The hospital has 9 Operation Theatres on the first floor with a fully equipped Cath lab. An average of 24 - 25 major and 30-34 minor operations are performed in a day.

As part of Ayushman Bharat the Community Health Officers (CHOs) are new cadre of non- physician health workers. CHOs will play a critical role in provision of expanded range of essential package of services as a part of Comprehensive Primary Health Care.

Our college has been selected as a study center from IGNOU for Certificate Course in Community Health. In the year 2020 the college has enrolled students from two batches i.e., from Jan -June 2020 56 students and in July - Dec 2020 50 students respectively. In the Year 2021 our college has also selected as a study center for the students enrolled in Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University (MPMSU) for this course.

For the year 2021 three batches July-Dec 2021 48 students of IGNOU, July-Dec 2021 46 students of MPMSU and Oct-March 2022 63 students of MPMSU batch has enrolled.

For the counselling session of both theory and practical 10 teachers from the college have been appointed as Academic Counsellors from IGNOU.

8.1.1 - Training in the clinical skills and simulation labs are organized with reference to acquisition and enhancement of skills in basic and advance procedures such as BLS/ALS, Venepuncture, ET intubation/suctioning, central line insertion procedures (PG- as per clinical specialty).

Choithram College of Nursing have Six fully equipped Nursing Skill labs ie 1. Nursing Foundation Lab, 2. Adult Nursing Lab/ Advance skill Lab, 3. Pre-clinical Lab, 4. Child Health Nursing Lab, 5. Obstetrics & Gynecology Lab, 6. Community Health Nursing lab. All Labs are equipped with various fidelity manikins to cater needs of student's clinical experience from basic to advance level e.g., Manikins for BLS/ALS, NRP/PALS O-CPR manikin, Neonatal Intubation Trainer, CPR and trauma care baby simulator, Multi-Venous Training Arm, Central Line and PICC line, 28week Preemie baby, Obstetric Susie Birth Simulator (Mechanism of labor, Active management of third stage labor), Episiotomy Suturing Simulator for Various types of suturing practice. Along with those, models, charts, protocols were displayed in labs for students' utilization. There is a well-defined policy for utilization of skill lab by undergraduate and post graduate students. Students are divided in small groups to practice in skill labs and the complete rotation is prepared by class teacher. For mentoring, demonstration and return demonstration 1:10 teacher student ration is maintained. Procedure demonstration and evaluation of skill is done through OSCE method, Drills, case scenario discussion and problem-solving approach. Students feedback on effectiveness of facility used to be taken.

Students were posted in infection control dept and CSSD in first year onwards where they were acquainting with infection control policies, waste disposal, Segregation, and management process. They participate in supervision rounds with infection control dept. staff to get better understanding of infection Control practices. Theory Classes were also arranged for students on Infection control which were taken by Infection control dept of Hospital. Students were posted in all three shifts, in final year, as a part of nursing administration where they must practice, assess and document quality standards including patient safety, quality indicators, quality of care, accuracy of documentation, spillage policy etc. In the Year 2020-21 as a part of value-added teaching, "Practice to Perfect" 7 days internship Training programme was introduced to familiarize students with NABH standards of Patient Safety policy and procedure and practices before steeping into clinicals as Professionals.
